Indian Society of Pediatric Nephrology (ISPN) Meeting Standard Operating Procedures (SOP)

ISPN Executive committee (ISPN-EC) meeting: ISPN -EC is the main administrative body of ISPN responsible for smooth functioning of the organization. The committee provides final approval to all the matters related to ISPN. The meeting is convened by the secretary or joint secretary with a notice of at least a week before the proposed date of meeting. The agenda for discussion may be requested from the members and the final agenda circulated at least a week prior to the meeting. Secretary is responsible for the minutes and circulating the same for approval. A meeting should have presence of at least 80 % of the members

Participants: President, secretary, Jt. Secretary, treasurer, Regional representatives (5), Ex-officio President or secretary of previous term

Invited members: Based on the agenda and need, chairperson of academic and fellowship committee, the convenors of various subcommittees may be requested to participate

Organization of national conference of ISPN [ISPNCON]

Background: The national conference of ISPN is conducted annually at the end of calendar year (November or December). The conference usually attracts major attention of not only paediatric nephrologists and trainees but also paediatricians and adult nephrologists. Currently, there is no formal process of expression of interest in hosting the conference or in the allotment of conference to various cities represented by ISPN members. Usually, the decision to allot the hosting rights are decided 1-2 year in advance during the GBM conducted at the time of ISPN. Following the discussion in GBM, consensus is obtained among the attendees in case more than one city is interested in hosting the conference. However, while selecting a host centre, certain criteria need to be considered to ensure uniformity and avoiding bias/ favouritism in allocating host centres for annual national conferences. There is a need for establishing uniform policy for selecting the host centres for ISPN conference to provide equal opportunities to all

ISPN Membership

Who can become a member?

ISPN membership requirements:

1. A Life member may reside anywhere in India
2. A member must have an active interest in pediatric nephrology and be medically qualified.
3. Members of Regional and/or National Pediatric Nephrology Societies from outside India will be eligible for ISPN membership.

What are the types of membership?

Full Individual Life Membership

- a) A doctor who is a citizen of India and has undergone at least one year of training in Pediatric nephrology or has > 80 % of time in clinical practice of Pediatric nephrology
- b) Scientist, holding a health-related doctoral degree, who manifests scientific interest in pediatric nephrology.

Life Member have the right to vote and hold office.

1. Background Pediatric nephrologists across India see large numbers of patients with a wide variety of kidney diseases in their busy practices. Unfortunately, this wealth of clinical material

Objectives of establishing ISPN registries

- (1) To enable clinical research studies in children with renal diseases prevalent in India (eg CKD, glomerular disease, tubular diseases)
- (2) To study nationwide management practices and clinical outcomes of common diseases.
- (3) To facilitate interventional studies eg RCTs, unified management protocols
- (4) To improve outcomes of children with kidney diseases by using registry data for clinical management guidelines, quality benchmarks and advocacy
- (5) To increase the publications in pediatric nephrology from India/ ISPN.

2. The 2 Model Framework – ISPN Registry versus ISPN Endorsed Registry

The table below summarises a suggested approach to creating the 2 types of registries

Institution of ISPN Young Investigator Award

Mandatory criteria:

- Active Member of ISPN for at least 3 years
- Less than 45 years of age

Criteria to be fulfilled:

- Duration of ISPN membership
- Scientific reports: Publications and research
- Research presentations – oral and poster
- Awards in Pediatric Nephrology
- Evidence of substantial independent research or major collaborative role in research projects
- Potential leadership & organization of research and care

The jury will be constituted by the academic committee with a tenure of 3 consecutive years and will comprise of 3 senior members from ISPN, one accomplished researcher who is an Indian citizen from outside paediatric nephrology community and one international paediatric nephrologist.

The awardee will receive the following: An engraved medallion and citation with cash award of Rs10,000; Complimentary registration to ISPNCON in award year

A nominee can only submit one application which will be valid for 3 years. In case the nominee is not selected within 3 years, he/she can reapply.

Timeline: Announcement: 1st week of January; Deadline for receiving application: 31st March
Evaluation and selection process – June -July; Announcing recipient -August-Sept;
Presentation of award - During annual conference -November-December
